RFP Non- Bid Evaporative Condenser -Questions & Answers

> What type of permits would we need to obtain from Park City to do this work?

Depending on the specifications of the proposed unit (such as footprint, weight etc.) different permits may be required. Potential permits include but are not limited to, building, electrical, plumbing and mechanical. If the proposed replacement unit has the same specs as the current unit only a mechanical permit would be required. As a city project, this permit will be exempt from building permit fees. However, the contractor will be responsible to obtain all of the required permits, submit all standard supplemental documentation, have inspections from the Park City Building Department and ensure that the permit is finalized and closed. You may present equipment specifications and your plan to the Park City Building Department to determine the specific permitting requirements for your proposal.

I am contacting you to see about exhibit b in the information packet. The file that I downloaded does not have Exhibit B for system drawings of the refrigeration system, floor, current evaporative condenser, and refrigeration skid. Is there any way I could get a copy of this? I believe that I can help with this project and give Park City a better unit.
