Materials Accepted:

- Paints, solvents and woodworking supplies including finishes, thinners, strippers and stains
- Automotive products — antifreeze, used oil, brake and transmission fluid, car batteries, gasoline, diesel and fuel additives, solvents and degreasers
- Household cleaners with high bleach or abrasive content, polishes, drain openers, oven cleaners
- Fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, insect repellents
- Rechargeable batteries, fluorescent light bulbs and neon tubes
- Pool and spa chemicals
- Mercury-containing items including switches, thermostats, thermometers and smoke detectors
- Propane and white gas fuel cylinders
- Film developing chemicals, acids

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS DROP-OFF INFORMATION:

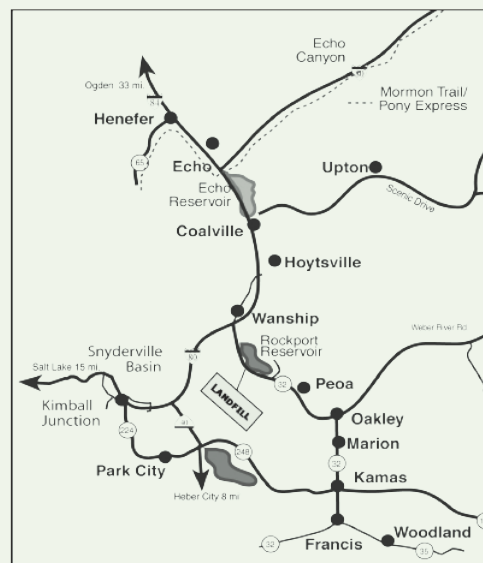
- Collected at the Summit County Landfill, Three Mile Canyon

HOW TO GET THERE

Take the Wanship Exit off of Interstate 80 turn right onto Route 32. Proceed south 3.5 miles. The landfill entrance is opposite the Rockport Reservoir with a big UTELITE sign on the gate. There's also a street sign that says Three Mile Canyon Road.



ELECTRONIC WASTE

Accepted daily at the Summit County Landfill, Three Mile Canyon. and Recycle Utah in Park City:

- Cell phones, pagers, pdas, ipods, computers, CPUs, keyboards, scanners, boom boxes, stereos, television sets, monitors, laptops, microwaves – any electronics.
- Free at the landfill.
- Recycle Utah fees do apply for safe disposal of toxic materials.

PHARMACEUTICAL DROP-OFF BOXES:

Never pour expired or unwanted prescription medicines down the drain or toilet because they will enter the water supply and harm fish and wildlife.

Drop boxes available 24/7 Park City Police Department, 2060 Park Avenue, Park City (Route 224 next to the Post Office)

Summit County Sheriff's Office drop box in the lobby: 6300 North Silver Creek Drive, Park City, (in the Summit County Justice Center behind Home Depot). Monday- Friday, 8 am to 5 pm except holidays.
