
445 Park City residents voted – Top 5% of zip codes




Utah: Components of Population Change


Six in ten Utahns feel positively about growth. Of those with negative feelings, more are Rural residents than Urban.





Utah County: 207,800 acres







(Residents Only)






These Growth Projections Could Occur in Different Ways

- New housing construction of entitled units




Summit County GOMB Population Projection






Wasatch County GOMB Population Projection






Utah's land is largely government owned and controlled.

In Summit and Wasatch Counties growth is largely unconstrained by ownership or geography.














Five Scenarios








Fruit and Vegetable Miles Traveled

Within Mexico, most export vegetables come from Sinaloa






Local New Capital Infrastructure Costs





Where Water Could Come From Across Scenarios











% of Households Within 1 Mile of a Center with Daily Services








Actions Taken

- 40% fewer emissions than today; well within health standards
- Utahns drive 25% less
- 98% of cars are cleaner, 35% are zero emissions
- All gasoline is cleaner
- All existing buildings are more 30% more efficient
- New buildings are 50% cleaner
- Wood burning decreases by 75% per person

*Non-Road sources include all engine powered devices that operate off roads, such as construction equipment, airplanes, lawn mowers, snow blowers, etc.



- It's never too late to start planning













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PARK CITY DEVELOPMENT TIMELINE
