Event to Celebrate Start of New Salt Lake to Park City Bus Service

What: Park City, Summit County and the Utah Transit Authority will hold an

event to celebrate the start of the new Park City to Salt Lake City Connect service. The new commuter route will officially begin service

on Monday, Oct. 3. It will be the first public transit connection

between Salt Lake and Summit counties.

- The new route is a cooperative effort between Utah Transit Authority, Park City and Summit County
- Service begins Monday, October 3, 2011
- The route will initially offer three trips in each direction in the morning and three return trips in each direction in the afternoon
- More trips will be added in December in support of the ski season
- Summit County stops will include multiple ski resorts, the Park City Old Town Transit Center, Kimball Junction and Jeremy Ranch
- Salt Lake City stops will include Salt Lake Central Station and the University of Utah
- Vehicles for the route are UTA express coaches equipped with bike racks and free WiFi where available
- The cost to ride is \$5.50 for a one-way trip; 30-day passes are available for \$242 (standard UTA passes not accepted)

Established in 1970, UTA has become a multi-modal transportation leader that is 100 percent accessible with a fleet of more than 600 buses and paratransit vehicles, 400 vanpools, 146 light rail vehicles, 63 commuter rail cars and 18 locomotives. UTA operates in six counties along the Wasatch Front, including 38 miles of light rail in Salt Lake County and commuter rail from Salt Lake City to destinations in Davis and Weber counties. In 2010, UTA carried riders on more than 39 million trips.
