

Youth Hockey Frequently Asked Questions

Do you offer Youth Learn To Play Hockey Programs?

Yes, we currently offer Youth Learn To Play Hockey classes periodically throughout the year. With an emphasis on fun, instruction is focused on the basic skills of power skating, stick handling, passing, shooting and positioning, developing skills for recreational and competitive play.

Does my child need to know how to skate before they sign up for Youth Learn To Play Hockey classes?

Yes, your child needs to be STABLE (stand without help) and ABLE (skate forward and stop). If your child does not meet those requirements please register for Learn To Skate classes.

How much do Youth Learn To Play Hockey classes cost?

It depends on the length of the class but we try to make it affordable for all and scholarship opportunities are available through the Youth Winter Sports Alliance. What equipment is required?

You are required to have a hockey helmet with facemask, elbow pads, hockey gloves, shoulder pads, hockey pants, shin pads and a mouth guard.

Do you have any equipment to rent?

Yes, we have a *limited numbers of sets and sizes* of youth equipment to rent. The rental equipment is made to fit 4 to 8 year olds. Currently, you may rent the equipment for the class for an additional \$10 or for the season for \$40.

How do I arrange to rent the equipment?

At least one day prior to the first class, please contact the Park City Hockey Director at 435-615-5702 or dmodrovsky@parkcity.org to set up an appointment to get fitted. As equipment is limited in size and number the sooner you arrange to get fitted the better the selection. You will also then have time to make other arrangements if the equipment doesn't fit or is all rented.

How do I sign my child up for Youth Learn To Play Hockey classes?

My child can skate forward and stop, we have the equipment and we're registered for the class, what time should we arrive at the arena?

You should arrive 30 minutes prior to the class start time to get dressed, get skates and be ready to step on the ice at the class start time.

What programs are there once my child completes Youth Learn To Play Hockey classes?
