424 Woodside Avenue – HDDR Review for Reorientation and Relocation - Reorientation (rotation) of a “Significant” Structure towards Woodside Avenue and Relocation of the house ten feet (10’). The primary façade of the Significant Structure is currently oriented towards Main Street and the applicant is proposing to rotate the structure 180 degrees so that the primary façade is oriented towards Woodside Avenue.

Public Hearing and Possible Action.

Design Guideline Revisions – Staff recommends that the Historic Preservation Board take public comment on the proposed changes to the Design Guidelines for New Commercial Infill Construction in Park City’s Historic Districts: Specific Design Guidelines for Sustainability and Sidebars: Landscaping and Vegetation. The Guidelines are incorporated into the Land Management Code in 15-13-2.

The Board will provide specific amendments to be made to the document if necessary; and make a recommendation to Planning Commission and City Council (Planning Commission and City Council review will be after the entire Guidelines are reviewed by the HPB)
