What is the time commitment?

This is a year-round program with weekly meetings on Mondays from 6:00-8:00 PM at the Park City Police Department 2060 Park Ave. (we will not meet on Holidays or Park City School District Breaks). In addition to these meetings, we have several events throughout the year. This program is a commitment as it requires 70% participation.

Who can Apply?

Eligible students between the ages of 14-20 and who live in the Greater Park City area, running through Park City, the Snyderville Basin, the East Side of Summit County, Heber City, and Wasatch County and are in compliance with the Boy Scouts of America and the Learning for Life Exploring Program.

How do I apply?
