WINTER TRAILS 2011

This map illustrates some of the Park City area winter trails available to snowshoers, cross country skiers, ski skaters and walkers. These public trails are groomed as conditions permit and allow human powered access to acres of protected open space and miles of the Park City trails system. These trails are maintained in a cooperative effort between the Mountain Trails Foundation, Park City Municipal Corporation and the Snyderville Basin Recreation District.

WINTER TRAILS ETIQUETTE

SKI TRAILS

- * Trails will be groomed "As Needed". Groomers may be on the trails at anytime. Please step aside and let them pass.
- * Tracks for cross country skiing may be set on certain trails.
- * Please! Walk and Snowshoe to the side of the tracks.
- * Ski in control - expect to see other recreationists, some moving faster/slower than others.

DOGS

- * Clean up after your pet! Be attentive around the trailheads.
- * Please leash your dog(s). This is a law in Summit County.
- * Clean up after your pet! Baggies are available at most trailheads or bring one or two from home.
- * Avoid encounters with wildlife. A dog chasing wildlife during winter can cause enough stress to kill the animal. Keep your dog(s) leashed.

WILDLIFE

- * Encounters with wildlife are likely on any of the trails or open areas in the Park City area. Wildlife can be very stressed during winter months, please do not disturb them.

BASIN RECREATION WINTER TRAILS (16 KM)

The trails groomed by Snyderville Basin Recreation District begin out of Willow Creek Park, the Fieldhouse or the McCleod Creek Trailhead. The grooming is done "as needed". These trails are generally flat and good for beginner skiers. Lots of dogs enjoy these trails too. More adventurous snowshoers would enjoy the Rob's and Colin's trails, near Sun Peak residential area.

ROUND VALLEY WINTER TRAILS (20 KM)

Located on publicly purchased Open Space, over 20 km of trails are groomed cooperatively by Park City Municipal Corporation and Mountain Trails Foundation "as needed". The terrain of rolling hills creates gradual climbs and descents. Numerous snowshoe paths throughout the area offer breathtaking views of the Wasatch Mountains.

WHITE PINE TOURING CENTER (\$) (20 KM)

Beginners, Intermediates and Experts will thrive on the wonderful trail system maintained exclusively by White Pine. Track passes, Ski and Snowshoe Rentals, Lessons, and Retail gear are available in the shop located on 1541 Thaynes Canyon Road, near Hotel Park City. All trails are groomed daily and have track set for classic skiing. No Dogs allowed.

RAIL TRAIL (20 KM)

The Summit County Historic Union Pacific Rail Trail is a 26 mile adventure! Gentle grades are inviting for all abilities. The trail is accessed from White Pine Touring (Bonanza Dr.), Prospector Park, Promontory or Wanship. Grooming occurs as conditions allow. Bonanza Drive to Promontory Trailhead is the most reliable snow pack. Visit mountaintrails.org for updates.
