

### HISTORY OF PARKS & FACILITIES

Pearle Snyder was the first child born in Park City and was also the first child to die here. Impassable snow drifts blocked attempts to transport her to Salt Lake for burial. The Snyder Family buried her on their 40-acre property, which they later donated to the City to be used as a City Cemetery.

The stone pillars and wrought iron fence were installed in 1883 through community fundraising.

**1879 Cemetery** 

The "City Grove" officially became City Park.

5 stone cooking hearths, 12 picnic tables, a restroom and parking area were established. Lastly, a cattle guard replaced the gate to keep wandering cattle from damaging the grass area.

1941 City Park

In 1977, the new Park City High School was built. 1982, Treasure Mountain Middle School Opened.

The original Park City High School Building (1255 Park Ave) was vacant, boarded up and consistently vandalized. The School Board started considering negotiations to sell the building and 4 acres of land for aprox \$3M.

1980s Library

City Facility and Parks development continues to grow with the Trash Compactor Building, Transit Center, Quinn's and Creekside Restrooms, Police Station, MARC, New China Bridge Parking Structure, Quinn's and Creekside Water Treatment Plant.

2000 and Beyond

#### 1928 & 1936 Schools

In 1928, Park City High School opened at 1255 Park Avenue. The cost of construction was \$196,000. The Salt Lake Tribune described it as a "credit to the City".

In 1936, The Marsac Elementary School opened to students after completing construction at a cost of \$108,000.

#### 1980 City Hall


City offices were split between the Memorial Building (427 Main) and City Hall (528 Main). Additional area was needed.

The City considered an addition to City Hall (\$600-\$900k) and purchasing Marsac for aprox \$1M. The difficult negotiations for Marsac began.


#### 1980s-1990s

Park City's building inventory, parks and facilities saw substantial growth including the China Bridge Parking Structure, Bus Barn, Public Works, Rotary and Main Street Restrooms.









#### YoY Total Personnel Costs

#### % Personnel Decomposition








#### YTD Expenses vs. FY21 Budget




#### Budget Summary Decomposition by Expense Type- FY 21












#### **YoY Total Personnel Costs**



#### YoY Change in Key Incremental Cost Drivers-FY20 vs. FY21




#### % Personnel Decomposition








#### **Square Feet per Facility**





#### **City Facility Solar Panels**








