	<u>Amur Maple</u> <i>Acer ginnala</i> 'Flame'	Small tree; often multi-stemmed. Beautiful fall color. Drought tolerant, cold hardy, tolerant of poor soils. Plant in full sun to part shade.
	<u>'Sensation' Box Elder</u> <i>Acer negundo</i>	Medium to large-sized tree. All male cultivar of native tree does not attract box elder bugs and is generally sucker-free. Young leaves appear reddish-orange in spring before turning deep green. Beautiful red and orange fall color. Very tough, drought tolerant, and does well in poor soils.
	<u>Bigtooth Maple</u> <i>Acer grandidentatum</i>	Medium-sized tree, medium growth rate. Native maple, common throughout Park City and Wasatch areas. Great fall color. Drought tolerant, cold hardy, tolerant of poor soils. Plant in full sun to part shade.
	<u>Serviceberry</u> <i>Amelanchier x grandiflora</i> 'Autumn Brilliance'	Small tree. Native to Park City and Wasatch Mountains. Nice fall color and beautiful white blossoms in spring. Drought tolerant, cold hardy, prefers well-drained soil. Plant in sun or shade
	<u>Western River Birch</u> <i>Betula nigra</i> 'Cully'	Medium to large-sized, fast-growing tree. Closely related to native river birches. Nice fall color and interestingly textured bark. Does well in poor soil conditions, including poor drainage. Plant in full sun to part shade.
	<u>Thornless Cockspur Hawthorn</u> <i>Crataegus crus-galli</i> 'Cruzam'	Tough, drought-tolerant, small tree. Tolerant of poor soil conditions. White flowers in spring mature into attractive red fruit which persist through winter and provide food for birds. Nice fall color. Prefers full sun.
	<u>Ginkgo</u> <i>Ginkgo biloba</i> 'Princeton Sentry'	Large tree with a compact, upright habit. Tolerant of drought and poor soil. Nice golden fall foliage. Prefers full sun.
	<u>Amur Maackia</u> <i>Maackia amurensis</i>	Medium-sized, slow growing tree. Tolerant of poor soil and drought. Interesting flowers in spring and nice fall color. Prefers full sun.

	<p><u>Flowering Crabapple</u> <i>Malus</i> 'Spring Snow' sproutfree</p>	<p>Small to medium-sized tree. Very showy white flowers in spring, but does not set fruit. Does well in all soil conditions, but prefers full sun.</p>
	<p><u>Austrian Pine</u> <i>Pinus nigra</i></p>	<p>Large, fast-growing tree with generally upright habit similar to native Ponderosa pines. Tolerant of drought and poor soils, but does not do well with poor drainage. Disease resistant to common pine beetles. Needs full sun.</p>
	<p><u>Narrowleaf Cottonwood</u> <i>Populus angustifolia</i></p>	<p>Large, fast-growing tree; native to Park City and Wasatch Mountains. Beautiful golden fall color. Tolerant of poor soils, but needs abundant water. Full sun.</p>
	<p><u>Columnar Swedish Aspen</u> <i>Populus tremula</i> 'Erecta'</p>	<p>Large, fast-growing tree with a narrow, upright habit; closely related to native aspens. Lovely trembling leaves turn golden in fall. Tolerant of poor soils and does better with summer heat than native aspens. Full sun.</p>
	<p><u>Quaking Aspen</u> <i>Populus tremuloides</i></p>	<p>Large, fast-growing tree; native and widespread throughout Park City area. Trembling leaves turn gold in fall. Tolerant of poor soils, but does not like standing water and can suffer during long heat waves. Full sun.</p>
	<p><u>White Oak</u> <i>Quercus alba</i></p>	<p>Large, wide-canopied tree with a medium growth rate. Tolerant of drought and poor soils. Leaves turn rusty-orange in fall. Plant in full sun to part shade.</p>
	<p><u>Bur Oak</u> <i>Quercus macrocarpa</i></p>	<p>Large, wide-canopied tree with a medium growth rate. Very tough once established; tolerant of drought, wind and poor soils. Largest native oak in North America. Full sun to part shade.</p>
