### NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

The structure at 80 King has been highly modified or and may be entirely new construction. The structure does not correspond with any traditional historic house types. It may have started out as a coal shed for an adjacent address, as noted on the 1968 tax card, but it is unclear if that structure was added onto or demolished and rebuilt. Since that time, the assumed shed was raised onto a significant foundation with a thin stone veneer with the rest of the structure being covered in wood drop siding, which may be original. The side gable roof is covered in asphalt shingles and several side by side paned windows are present on the facades. Since the photos were taken for the 2008 Park City Historic Site Inventory, a massive two story addition has been built adjacent to the renovated shed structure. A garage has also been added on the south side of the building, underneath the addition. The roof for the addition has multiple gables, and is covered in asphalt shingles. The addition is clad with a similar type of siding. There are several multi-pane windows on the addition and the main doors are also multi-pane. A wood railing leads up the stairs to a covered porch which is supported by square piers, with a balcony above the porch. The cumulative formal and material changes have diminished its historic value.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

(Briefly describe those characteristics by which this property may be considered historically significant.)

This shed was built in 1920, according to Summit County records. It was shown as a dwelling room by the time of the 1929 Sanborn, where it was listed as 96 King. The 1930 census does not show anyone living at a 96 King, though this could have been part of the boardinghouse at 88 King, which contained six Finnish miners (see Historic Site Form, 74 King Road). The 1940 census lists William McDermott living at 90 King Road, which could be alluding to this cabin based on the order of the census data. McDermott was a mill worker at a mining company who had been born in Ireland in the late 1870s. By that time, J. Melrose Matthie owned the adjacent house, so he owned this outbuilding as well. It was listed as a coal storage shed on a 1960s tax card. It is unclear if it was built as a storage shed or as a rental dwelling unit.

This property was sold as an outbuilding for neighboring 74 King until it was sold separately from the adjacent house in 1997. Platted as a separate property in 2005 (as the McKernon plat), the structure was lifted onto a new foundation around 2000. A massive house has been added to the original cabin since 2008, diminishing the historical integrity of the structure and rendering it ineligible for National Register listing.







80 King Road. East elevation. November 2013.






