NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

(Briefly describe the property and its setting. 1021 Park is a pyramid type house that does not appear to have undergone any major alterations or additions. A small porch is shown on the south side in some of the Sanborn maps, but it has since been removed. It is currently in a state of major disrepair. The pyramid house is one of the three main types of houses built during the historic Park City mining era, and, of those three, is the most recent, occurring mostly at the end of that time period. The hipped roof is sheathed with wood shingles, many of which are falling off especially in the porch area. A brick chimney is present on the south side of the house. The metal pipe at the top of the chimney has been knocked or blown over and is resting on the roof in the most recent images. The house is clad in wood drop siding some of which is also falling off. The windows on the front façade are two large panes flanked by narrow panes. The door is centered on the front façade and is flanked by the previously mentioned windows. Other windows on the sides look to be wood framed casements. The porch is covered by a hipped roof that is supported by square posts and topped with a decorative frieze. The foundation is not visible, and its material is unknown, but it is noted as being

either wood sills or no foundations at all, as noted on the tax cards. The house remains relatively unmodified. The overall form and materiality of the building remains intact and the building retains its historic value.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

(Briefly describe those characteristics by which this property may be considered historically significant.)

This house appears on the 1889 Sanborn Insurance map, which was the earliest map for this area, making it difficult to determine exactly when it was built. The title history shows that a mortgage was taken out on the property in 1887, making this the most likely year of construction. The owners at this time were Frank and Matilda Hansen. They appear on the 1900 census, likely living in this house, though no addresses were given on that census. They lived at the house with their five children, and Frank worked as a quartz millman. The property went up for tax sale in 1902, and was sold to Chris Anderson.

Nels C. Anderson appears on the 1910 census living in this house, he is assumed to be the Christian Anderson discovered in the title history. He worked at a concentrating mill and lived in the house with his wife Nettie and their three children. He sold the house in 1912 to Amelia Guymon.

The only record that could be found of Amelia Guymon indicated that she lived in Salt Lake. It is possible that she rented the house out during this time, but this is unconfirmed as no census occurred while she owned the house. The next owner was Mary Corrigan.

Mary Corrigan appears on the 1920 and 1930 census living in this house with her son Frank and his family. She was born in Scotland and immigrated to the U.S. in 1887. Frank worked as an electrician for a mine. She sold the house in 1938 to Margaret Meaney.

Margaret Meaney appears on the 1940 census, living at this house with her daughter and son-in-law and their children. She worked on a lunch project for the Works Progress Administration and her son-in-law William Hawkins worked as a miner. No other information could be found on her or her family. She sold the house in 1944 and it is currently owned by William and Pamela Hart.




1021 Park Avenue. Northeast oblique. November 2013.




1021 Park Avenue. East elevation. November 2013.

One story square-shaped frame dwelling with a hip roof (c. 1900). Shingle siding has been added. A front porch still exists with less decorative wood post supports. 1907 Sanborn map shows no porch.

Front windows were three one-over-one double hung windows--two south of entry and one north.

The dwelling contributes to the Park City district in its vernacular style--frame construction, hip roof, and porch.

Also a part of the holdings of David C. McLaughlin, later to Mayer Ascheim. In 1902 a Decree granted to M. S. Ascheim from Third District Court, Summit County-including 1/2 interest in "Frame House" (See Park City Abstracts, Book I, p. 103). In 1904 to Julius Frankel--up for tax sale in 1912, but assessed to one Chris Anderson. Others as follows: Amelia J. Guyman, 1912; Mary Carrigan, 1914; Margaret Meaney, 1938; and to Bert Aubrey in 1944.

Mayer S. Ascheim, a Jewish merchant, operated the M. S. Ascheim Merc. Co. in Park City. The establishment served as a general merchandise outlet specializing in mining supplies. M. S. Ascheim was a pioneer merchant in Park City, opening his business house in the late 1870s (listed in 1883-1884 Graham Utah Directory). In the 1890s he served as one of the directors of the Park City Water Works along with R. C. Chambers, W. V. Rice, Thomas Cupit, and Henry Newell. In 1902 Ascheim sold his enterprise to the Blyth-Fargo Company.




