NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

1043 Park is a T/L cottage that has had many of its original materials altered. The T/L cottage, also known as a cross-wing, is one of the main three house types built during the historic Park City mining era. The cross gable roof is sheathed with standing seam metal. The house is clad with vertical board siding, which is not original and likely replaced the bricktex material mentioned in a 1978 Structure Information form, which replaced the possibly original drop siding. The windows on the front façade are all one-over-one double hung type windows. Two windows are located in the front end gable. Another of the same kind of window is left of the door on the porch area. The door is a wood frame and panel door with a nine paned upper light. The porch is covered by a shed extension of the main roof, which is supported by round posts that taper towards the top. The foundation is covered and its material is

unknown. The site has a slight slope and is neatly landscaped. Though the building retains its historic form the material changes have diminished its historic value.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

The following history was given in the 1978 Historic Site Form:

"Contributory to the Park City residential district as a tum-of-the-century mining town cottage. Its basic design with gable roof and frame construction renders it as visibly compatible within the district.

George G. Snyder originally owned a large tract of land of which this property was a part. In 1883 Lot 11 to David C. McLaughlin, and Lot 12 to Hance O. Young. According to abstracts in 1910 the property up for tax sale, which had been assessed to H. J. Sweat. It was redeemed in 1928 by one LeRoy J. Sanger, and again by Sanger in 1934, with a Quit

Claim transacted in 1939 and filed in 1945 to Gusty Sanger. To Ed J. and Anna R. McPolin in 1955 and in 1976 sold to the Deardens.

Hans (Hance) O. Young, early property owner, was a Norwegian business and mining man, having settled in Park City in 1860. LeRoy J. Sanger, a later owner of the home, was born in Bingham, Utah, in 1884. Sanger married Augusta J. Sweat in 1913 in Park City and resided there for thirty years, working as an electrician for the Silver King Coalition Mining Co."

The house is currently owned by Park Avenue Star LLC.






1043 Park Avenue. East elevation. November 2013.




1043 Park Avenue. Southeast oblique. November 2013.
