#### NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

1102 Park is a pyramid type house that recently had a large addition built. The pyramid house is one of the main three house types built during the historic park City mining era. The two story addition was built sometime between 1995 and 2006. The hipped roof is sheathed with composition shingles, as is the complex roof of the addition. This replaced standing seam metal roofing shown in 1995. A brick chimney can be seen at the peak of the roof. The house is clad with drop-novelty wood siding, which was either uncovered or replaced the shingle siding shown in the 1995 photo. The windows all appear to be one-over-one double hung sash windows, with a pair on either side of the off center door. The door is a wood frame and panel door with a large upper light. The porch wraps from the west façade to the south façade and is covered by an extension of the main roof. This is supported by square posts that are topped with decorative brackets and are similar to the brackets shown in the c. 1940 photo, though

smaller. The porch is slightly raised and has steps leading up to it in a few areas. The foundation is not visible. A concrete driveway has been added to the north, probably at the same time as the addition. The cumulative formal and material changes have diminished its historic value.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

This house was built sometime between 1907 and 1929. Information from a previous Historic Site Form states that it was built approximately 1909. The owner of the property at this time was Richard L. Richardson. He appears on the 1910 census, living in another house on Park Avenue with his wife Jennie and their daughter Grace. He owned his own junk business, as stated by the census. It is unknown if they ever lived in this house. The house was sold to Kenneth Gibson in 1921.

The house does not appear on the 1920 or 1930 censuses, and it is unknown if anyone occupied it during that time span.

Henry Kenneth Gibson appears on the 1940 census, here with his wife Hannah and their 3 children. He worked as a utility man for a mine. He was born in Park City in 1896 and died in 1943. His wife retained ownership of the house until 1956, when she sold it to Arthur and Jannett Moore. It is currently owned by the US Bank National Association.













1102 Park Avenue, Park City, Summit County, Utah Intensive Level Survey—Sanborn Map history

### "Ken" Gibson Called

Early this morning at the L. D. S. hospital, "Ken" Gibson, died following a long illness with heart trouble. Mr. Gibson had been confined to his home since January, 1942, and had gradually weakened until yesterday, when he was taken to Salt Lake City for treatment, but to no avail, death occuring at 1:15 a. m. this morning.

Henry Kenneth Gibson was born in this city on February 11, 1898, living here during his boyhood days and attending our public schools. Twenty-seven years ago he made his home in Bingham Canyon, for 15 years—returning here 12 years ago, being employed at the Silver King shop, until forced to give up work.

He is survived by his wife, Annie Marchant Gibson, his step-father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Than Gibson, one brother, Vern; three daughters, Mrs. Lon Larsen, Donna and Patsy Gibson, and one son, Wallace, and a foster-sister, Mrs. Emmett Brooks.

Funeral arrangements have not as yet been completed.
