NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

1420 Park is a pyramid type house that has undergone significant changes. The pyramid house is one of the three main house types built during the historic mining era, and is the most recent of those three, occurring mostly towards the end of that period. A moderate addition was built on the rear of the house sometime between the 1941 Sanborn map and the 1995 photo. The hipped roof is sheathed with standing seam metal, as is the gable roofed garage. The house is clad with aluminum siding and wood board-and-batten siding covers the lower part of the front façade. There are two large picture windows on the front façade, with one being on the front most part of the house, and the other in the porch area. The main door is covered by a wood screen door and its type was not verified. The porch is inset into the corner and the section of the hipped roof covering it is supported by an open metal support. A metal railing surrounds the porch. A wood fence surrounds the entire yard. The garage on the

property is made of concrete block and has a small amount of siding in the gable of the roof. The cumulative formal and material changes have diminished its historic value.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

(Briefly describe those characteristics by which this property may be considered historically significant.)

This house appears on the 1907 Sanborn Insurance map, which was the first of those maps to cover this area, making it difficult to determine when exactly it was constructed. The title history states that it was owned by the Ontario Silver Mining Company until 1935, which may be the case, but it is possible that the house was sold much earlier than that, possibly off the records of the city, and then recorded or made official in 1935. This is a common occurrence in early Park City record keeping, especially concerning properties that were owned by mining companies. However, there is no available record of any other owner earlier than 1935.

The house does appear on the 1930 census, when it was being rented by Frank and Mary Diamond and their three children. Frank was a miner at that time, but was later a janitor at the local high school. He and his family lived in Park City for many years, before moving to Dugway in 1952. The title history states that the house came under the ownership of Harris Mills by 1935.

Harris Mills appears on the 1940 census, living in this house with his wife Edna and their daughter Betty. He worked in a family business, Mills Brothers Dairy, but it is unknown what role he filled there. Due to a break in the title history, it is unknown how long they owned the house, but it had been sold by 1962. It is currently owned by Christopher Hayes and Gina Lewis.







