INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

Ownership

Per resolution 06-2018, only qualifying residents with "immediate need" are allowed to purchase lawn plots, plus one additional if desired. A qualifying resident is anyone:

- Born in Park City Miner's Hospital
- Owning property or currently residing in Park City Proper
- Having resided within the City limits of Park City for a period of at least 10 years consecutively.

"Immediate need" has been defined as a qualifying resident experiencing a death in the family and needing a traditional lawn burial space. *Memorial Wall spaces and Cremation Garden sites* are available for immediate and pre-planning purposes. A limited number of Memorial Wall spaces are available for non-residents.

Anyone wishing to purchase a burial right in the Park City Cemetery including lawn plots, plaque sites, and cremation garden sites, must show proof of eligibility, which may include:

- Summit County Property Tax Assessment
- Current Utility Bill showing a Park City (proper) service address
- Park City Birth Certificate
- Written testimony from a long-time Park City resident verifying applicant's eligibility
- Recommendation from Park City Historical Society

Owner or owner's representative may determine who may or may not be buried in the property; they may also determine the verbiage on a plaque site located on a Memorial Wall or Cremation Garden marker.

Purchase price includes the perpetual care of the property at the City's expense. The City assumes no responsibility for damage to coping, fences, plaques in ground or on walls, cremation garden markers, or plant materials installed without the permission of the City.

Burial rights are non-transferable. If an owner wishes to sell their burial right, the City may buy it back at the original purchase price. Owners may not sell plots, plaque sites, or cremation sites to others.

Interment

All interments must be approved by the Cemetery Sexton. No interment will be permitted, or marker allowed on any lot not fully paid for except by special consent of the cemetery sexton.

- The City requires a concrete vault for full casket burials
- Stacked burials will be allowed only on approval of the Cemetery Sexton. Up to 3 cremations are allowed stacked above a full casket burial.
- A copy of the death certificate must be provided to the Cemetery Sexton
- Transit permits are required for all out of state remains wishing to be interred
- No pets may be buried in the cemetery or Cremation Garden, nor memorialized on a Memorial Wall Plaque.

Monuments

Monuments placed after 1993 are to be maintained by the owner and must remain in a safe condition. Any grave markers or plants must be approved by the Cemetery Sexton prior to installation. All grave markers require a hold harmless agreement, and must meet the monument sizing regulations.

- Upright monuments require a one-time fee
- All upright monuments must contain pins placed between separate stones
- Owners are responsible for correct layout, design, and sizing prior to delivery
